HORSE CAMP 2008 – IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Fees: The fee for Horse Camp 2008 is \$425.00 per week for day camp, Monday thru Friday, from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. A \$25.00 discount will be given if payment in full is received at least 30 days prior to your camp start date.

Pre-Registration: Completed registration package must be received to insure your child's camp reservation. Registration package includes this completed application, a signed waiver and release and a \$200.00 non-refundable deposit. Your completed registration will be confirmed by email.

At Check-In (first day of camp): Check-In will begin at 8:40am on Monday morning. At this time, all fees must be paid in full by cash, check or credit card (Mastercard, VISA, Discover or American Express). Also at check-in, a copy of your child's health insurance card (front and back) must be provided for our records. In the event of any emergency, your child will be transported to Union General Hospital in Blairsville, Georgia.

Attire: Appropriate riding attire: Long pants, sleeveless or short sleeve shirts (no tank tops) that can be tucked into pants. Low heeled boots or athletic shoes. Riding helmets are provided by Trackrock Stables or bring your own. Each camper will receive one Trackrock Stables t-shirt. Additional shirts are available for purchase for \$12 each. Included is \$_____ for ____ additional shirts.

Lake swimming: Bathing suit, extra T-shirt for cover-up, sunscreen, towel, and beach shoes. Swimming is supervised by an adult – no certified lifeguard is present.

Lunch: Campers should bring their own lunch. We do have a refrigerator, if needed. Snacks will be provided in the afternoon.

Personal Horses: Students may bring their personal horse, if approved by the Instructor in advance of camp date. There will be boarding fees for personal horses.

A Typical Day at Camp: The day will start with classroom instruction and activities, then the camper will care for, groom & saddle their horse, and move on to instruction in the arena. After lunch, there will be free time for swimming and other activities before an afternoon trail ride. Before leaving for the day, the student will feed and care for their horse, then meet back in the classroom to discuss their day. (Activities may vary due to weather or any changes the instructor deems necessary.)
